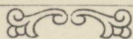

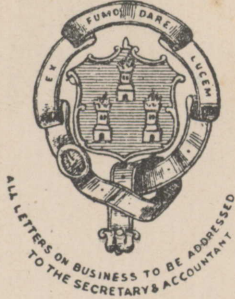



Further to my letter of the 12th inst., I am instructed by my clients, Messrs Wm Scott & Co (Dublin) Limited to point out that their premises No 2 Lower Sackville Street, Dublin, were fitted with a Special Fire Alarm System in connection with the Great Brunswick Street Fire Station by a private wire, which system costs upwards of £80, besides an annual rental for the private wire. The good working of the alarm was tested every morning, and on the occasion of the destruction of the premises in April last the Alarm acted, but Capt Purcell informed my clients that he could not send out the fire men owing to the danger of their being shot. Also as protection for my clients' books and records, a Milner Safe was built into a wall of about 36" thick, but notwithstanding these precautions the entire premises and contents were wholly demolished. In view of the apparent under-insurance of the property, this explanation seems desirable.



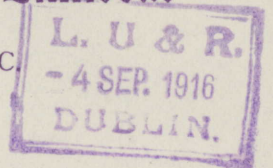

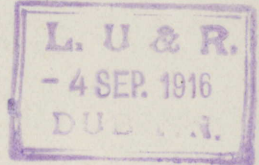
