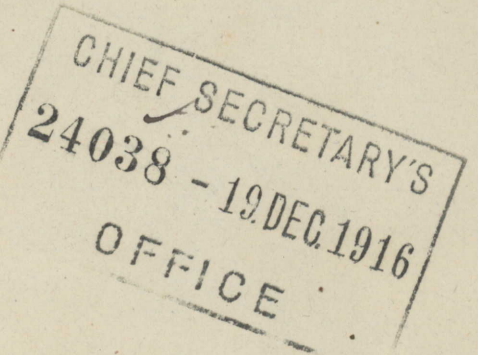

I beg to report that on the 25th of April last I gave my bicycle to Const Manning of this station to go to Glavinbridge on urgent duty, as it was on that date Glavinbridge Barracks was attacked by the Rebels. Const Manning was taken prisoner by the Rebels, and my bicycle was also taken by the Rebels. Const Manning informed me that he could not identify who took the bicycle.

I purchased this bicycle about twelve months before it was taken. it cost me £ 11 : 15. and I used it very little as there never was much to be done on bicycles at this station, so that it was almost new when it was taken.

Were I to go into a cycle shop now to purchase a similar machine I should have to pay about £ 14 : 15 : 0. allowing the
the

the outside limit for wear
and tear for the twelve months
in use the lowest price I
could lay on the machine
would be £12:0:0.

I claimed compensation from
Records at Quarter Sessions
but claim was adjourned.
Const Donovan of this station
from whom a bicycle was
taken on same day was
paid about three months ago.
I would kindly ask my
authorities to submit my
claim for consideration by
Government.

REPORT OF OUTRAGE.

NOTE.—The Officer reporting must give a clear statement of the occurrence, mentioning the day of the Month and Hour when perpetrated. He must state if he has visited the scene and made personal inquiries on account for the omission; what steps have been taken to discover the offenders and to make them amenable, and with what prospect of success. If arrested, where and when they are to be tried, and if absconded, he will send up as accurate a description of them as can be obtained. The Report must be written as legibly as possible, and the names of Persons and Places with perfect distinctness. In cases of serious injury, or of Homicide, the nature of the instrument with which the injury was inflicted, or blow struck, should if possible be stated. If any delay has occurred in reporting the event, the cause must be explained. In cases of the stealing of property, a description thereof is to be sent up, if deemed expedient, for insertion in the Hue-and-Cry. In all such cases a sworn information should be had. The assigned motive should be stated in all cases, where it is not obvious.

on duty to Clurinbridge. He
was arrested by Armed Rebels
who took from him the bicycle
which he was riding (borrowed
from Const Ed Brennan). A
Revolver R.I.C pattern and
5 rounds of service ammunition
and one whistle & chain - public
property. The Constable was
kept a prisoner until 29th April
when he returned to Shilcolgan.
He was taken into Galway the
same evening. He swore an
information before Mr Young
J.P. Galway on 24th ult. as
I was not made aware of this
I could not have reported the
Case sooner.
