Dear Sir,

The Governing Body of the Athenaeum Enniscorthy, which was taken possession of by the Rebels and held by them till they surrendered, wish to appeal to the Committee for some Compensation for the damage done to the billiard cloth, windows and ^a clock, and also for the ~~damages~~ loss by their occupation.

The Athenaeum was subsequently occupied by the Military for about 14 days, being a loss of revenue to the Governing Body besides the expense of gas and water for which they are not making any claim.

We trust that your Committee may see their way to make an allowance to the Governing Body.
