

First, second and Third Floors.

14 Squares of Polished Plate Glass to be supplied to replace the broken ones caused by recent disturbances.

The window sashes where damaged by bullets, cills, ditto and entire reveals to windows to be carefully repaired making good the timber work with red deal, properly primed, and the cement reveals with clean washed sand and Portland cement.

To erect a proper pole scaffolding to the front of house, making good the brickwork where damaged by bullets, point and wig the entire frontage.

Interior.

Ceilings of the three rooms to front to be repaired, stripped, repapered with similar quality paper, the cornices tinted ivory white, and walls to have the broken plastering repaired, stripped and repapered with paper say at 2/6 per piece with suitable friezes where they exist at present. Woodwork to be water pumiced, stopped and painted with two coats genuine lead and oils. The old paint to be cleaned off the outside of window sashes and cills after repairs, and painted three coats finishing in enamel green. Repair mantelpiece in top room.



Estimate for Painting works and repairs in connection with recent fire at No. 133 Stephen's Green.

Top Floor, Back room.

About 80' lineal of flooring to be taken up and new 7 X 1" planes and jointed flooring supplied and put down. 4' of new moulded skirting and architraves to door and moulding repaired.

Supply and glase all the broken glass consisting of 8 panes.
Repair the cills to window, architrave and shutters.

Ceiling.

Thoroughly wash the entire ceiling and h ips, open up the cracks and stop with Keen cement, prepare, interline with strong lining paper and afterwards whiten. Strip the old paint from walls rub down, prepare and paper, clean off the old paint from woodwork where blistered and charred, thoroughly pumice, prepare and paint 2 and 3 coats and finish in approved shade.

Clean and stop the mantelpiece and paint 2 coats. Stain the margins of floor where they exist.

Running a new supply of gas pipe in position near window in & compo about 30' lineal. Supply bracket with mantel and globe complete.

Ceiling and hips to be washed, prepared and statuary whitened saving the walls from injury, dusting same, and washing woodwork.

Bathroom.

Ceiling and hips treated as above. Walls to be stripped, rubbed down, prepared and papered with suitable hanging. Woodwork prepared, pumiced, and painted 2 coats.

for the sum of £1. 10. 0.

Corridor outside above rooms.

Ceilings and hips as above, walls to be stripped and repapered, old paint to be cleaned off where blistered with fire, entire pumiced, painted 2 and 3 coats, finished to a suitable shade.

for the sum of £2. 10. 0.

Main Staircase.

Lantern light to have glass repaired where cracked with the heat. Woodwork to bars inside painted 2 coats, all the ceilings to be washed, prepared and distempered, entire walls as painted in a cream shade as at present to be thoroughly washed down, cracks opened and stopped, touched up, prepared and painted a rich carmine shade as may be selected.

All the woodwork consisting of doors, architraves, balusters stringboard, spandril sheeting, sliding strong door, etc. as at present painted white to be well pumiced, filled where requisite, painted 2 coats, finishing in Indestructible enamel. Dado to be treated with one coat of enamel color. Flats and risers to have the old blistered paint cleaned off, rubbed down, prepared, grounded stained and varnished.
