Dear Sir,

I had two Applications for Criminal Injury arising out of the late Rebellion. They were served for the Quarter Sessions in June last and adjourned to October, and again adjourned to the coming Sessions this month. Under the circumstances of the adjournments I was rather misled and did not put in my claims to your Committee, but I trust the Committee will now be able to entertain them. The first claim was made on behalf of Mr. Michael O'Brien of Rockview, Tuam, he claimed a sum of £204-18-1 under the following circumstances - he sends round Vans selling Tea through the country and on the 27th. of April one of his Carts was seized at Kiltulla near Athenry and taken to Moyode where the Rebels had a Camp. He claims a sum of £6-10-0 Cash taken from his man, which the man had collected; £6-13-4 for 40 lbs. of Tea, and the balance is made up of loss by his Books having been taken, which renders it impossible for him to collect his Debts. The second Claim was one on behalf of the Driver who claims £7-16-0 for a Suit of Clothes, an Overcoat, two pairs of boots and a rug his property which were taken.

I would be greatly obliged by you letting me hear from you as soon as convenient, and sending me any Forms it is necessary to have filled up.
