The bicycle was of the greatest assistance to me in the discharge of ~~my~~ work (dairying) which has to be done in a wide country & city district where some mode of conveyance is absolutely necessary, ^{as} it is I cannot replace.

If the Committee ^{considers my} claims worthy of recognition I shall feel grateful.
