For papers belonging to the Irish Industrial Printing & Publishing Co. Ltd destroyed on the premises of the Freeman during last Easter week. The particulars of this claim were supplied to the Freeman on Oct 6, 1916 who will vouch for them. They take the view that we should submit our claim to you.

I am merely the liquidator and was not aware until recently that some of the type was lost. I am responsible for the assets of the Company and it is my duty to make this application. No premises were closed on the Saturday before the Rebellion and to complete the work of the Irish Farmer we sent some forms out to be machined by the Freeman and in this way the type and plates were lost.
