With reference to your letter of 2<sup>nd</sup> Inst, relative to claim by John Kinneen of Dunsandle for injury to cattle. I beg to inform you that the rebels while in occupation of Moyode castle drove ten bullocks off a grazing farm at Seepark. An information was made, and in the Notice of application for compensation for malicious injury, the ten bullocks were described as the joint property of Julia Daly, John Kinneen, Henry J. Synnott, and Major Denis St. George Daly. I understand that the animals were really the joint property of Major Daly and the reps. of his brother the late Mr. Wm Daly, and that Mrs. Julia Daly (Widow) John Kinneen, and Henry J. Synnott, claim to be the representatives of the said Wm Daly.

There is no doubt about the animals being driven off, but I might venture to suggest a little caution being necessary to avoid paying twice for the same damage.

I am informed the Solicitor for applicants intended claiming £5 at Gr. Sess. for the ten animals. Perhaps Major Daly may send you a claim in respect of the other five.

James Darmody } Two mules were taken  
away from this man  
both were recovered but one was fatally  
injured by having his back broken  
and the other was much injured and he  
suffered certainly the entire loss of £30
