I beg to report that Mr. J. Farrell did suffer the loss complained of in this note. On the 27. 4. 16 he sent his men & horses to Galway for two Ton of Flour & when returning home & near the Village of Craughwell there were ^{a number of} men on the public road & they men & horses & all were seized. They men were made Prisoners & conveyed to Moyade Castle where they Rebels were Camped. Farrells horse & Cart was run up some few days after & some 5 bags of his Flour found on the public road near Ardahan. The horse's harness was all damaged or destroyed.
