I beg to state that Mr.
James Dermody of Killescaul
hinted out to me on 13th May 16
two cows which were taken from
his lands at Esker on morning of
27th April 1916 by Rebels and which
he found at Moyode on 29th April
1916. I did not observe anything
the matter with one of the cows, but
the other cow was in a very crippled
condition, and appeared to be very
badly injured, her back must have
been strained. I saw this cow
again in September last and the
result of the injury was very noticeable
as she used to drop down in the
back every few steps she would
walk. Dermody had this
cow attended to by Mr. Kelly
V.S. Arkady. He was seeking
compensation for malicious injury
to amount of £30 and I consider
this claim a just one
