Sir,

Referring to my call at your Office on Friday last, I now enclose Claim (in duplicate) for value of my wife's bicycle which was taken from Kelly's Shop in Lower Abbey St. and destroyed, during the Rebellion. Mr Kelly having undertaken to look after the claim, the matter was left in his hands. When I learned the proper procedure I had the claim made out in my wife's name but unfortunately, owing to illness, she has been unable to make the necessary declaration. I have therefore completed the form in my own name and trust, under the circumstances, you will see your way to make allowance for the delay in furnishing the claim.

I may mention that in respect of the claim for £7 for the loss of my own practically new bicycle (taken by military from Amiens St. Cloak Room) I have received £4/10/- from Gt. Northern Ry. which they say is the amount allowed by your Committee. I would like to say that the amount I claimed was perfectly fair and honest, and based on the actual valuation of an expert. I regard it as a hardship that my claim should be reduced by £2/10/-, especially in view of the increased price I shall be obliged to pay for a new bicycle.
