We received a cheque from the Chief Secretary's Office for £46:5:0 in settlement of claim amounting to £75:5:0 made by Thomas J. Rogers the tenant of 145 Farnell Street for goods looted and destroyed.

Thomas Rogers is a weekly tenant of the premises 145 Farnell Street and our Mr. W. G. Bradley is one of the owners of these premises.

Shortly after the rebellion Mr. Rogers came to us and informed us that his stock had been looted during the rebellion and two windows had been smashed ^{by} bullets and the door broken open and damage done to the extent of about £5. At that time we lodged an information with a view to taking proceedings under the Malicious Damage Act in which the damage to the premises were mentioned and subsequently an application was lodged with the County Court for the purpose of making a claim in respect of the damage done to the premises and the stock looted. We enclose copy information and copy preliminary notice to verify this statement.
