Dear Sir,

We are in receipt of your favour of the 16th inst. in reference to our claim and in reply beg to point out that shortly after the disturbance in April last we forwarded a statement of our claim to the Town Clerk in Dublin, as we understood from a notification in the newspaper, that he was the proper person to receive it. We also lodged a claim with the Post Office authorities at the same time, but as the parcel was not registered they did not admit liability, for more than £1, the utmost allowed by their regulations. It was only indeed quite lately that we learned of the existence of your Committee as we saw no notice regarding it in the

local Press and we cannot understand why the Town Clerk accepted our claim in the first instance without comment and did not afterwards hand it over to the proper authority. So far as we knew we complied with official requirements, and even though it is now so late, we trust you will consider these special ^{circumstances} and if at all possible, that you will, as an act of grace at least admit our claim.
