Dear Sir, *for your losses have been paid from Messrs. Curran, Messrs. McBurney & the late firm, and in this case or leave the thing dissolved the France on our side. It is now done for accepting claims, but in the final case of this case claims from this business will be considered if brought here by Messrs. Curran & Co.*  
I have been consulted by Mr Stephen Farrell late of No. 34 Ir. Abbey Street, Dublin now of No 107 Connaught Street, Phibsboro', Dublin

who made an application some time ago to your Committee for compensation in respect of some of his effects and other property which he had in his possession which were destroyed in the burning of the premises of Messrs Meccredy Percy & Co Ltd by whom he was employed. I understand that my client has been interviewed by one of your Assessors to whom he gave all the necessary information some five or six months ago. I also understand that the sum of £1:17:6 has been paid to my client in respect of the portion of his claim which represented his personal property. Owing to a misunderstanding of the scheme adopted by your Committee, my client embodied in his Claim several items which were not his own property, but for which he was responsible as a Bailee, namely, articles which he had on approbation from Messrs McBirney & Co Ltd and Messrs Crotty & Co Ltd and a Manuscript Book of original Poems by Mr Cathal McGarvey and two Officer's Ruck-sacks the property of the ~~Re-tan~~ Motor Company.
