Dear Sir,

With reference to the claim put forward on behalf of the Corporation of Dublin for loss of rates, viz., £16,000, as a result of the buildings destroyed in the recent Rebellion, I am directed to state that the Municipal Council now apprehend that, owing to the unavoidable delay in the settlement of the claims of the Property Owners, it will not be possible for them to expect any revenue from rating out of the newly erected buildings for probably five years to come.

In the circumstances I am now instructed to amend their original claim for one year's rates to the extent of making it a claim for such rates as may be unobtainable by reason of the non-erection of the buildings up to a period of five years.

If it is essential for your purposes that an actual sum should be put forward, £48,000 would probably be the least loss involved, as it is exceedingly doubtful if a single building will be completed and rateable before the expiration of three years, and some of them may not be replaced before five years have elapsed.
