Dear Sir.

In reference to your esteemed communication and particulars sent us, we have pleasure in handing you, herewith, a Ground Plan showing how we believe you will be having the Shop Front done. We assume that you will have a depth to Lobby in centre of 6ft., and we estimate the glass of Shop Front will be 2ft. from pavement. and 10ft. from Window Board to ceiling.

WINDOW ENCLOSURES

We, therefore, estimate, after your having had the Shop Front erected, to lay to both windows stout Window Boards, each 2ft. back to front, with panelled Pine under, and over each to provide and fix a Mahogany WINDOW ENCLOSURE reaching to ceiling, each being divided at a height of 6ft.3" from pavement with a Pine-framed clear plate glass Centre Division, thereby dividing the top of window from the bottom. Enclosures would be shaped as shown in Ground Plan, and each fitted with three opening air-tight sashes at bottom and three at top, glazed with clear plate glass and having nickelled handles. The ends next Shop Door would be mirror-lined, and panalled Mahogany on the outside.

To provide and fix MIRRORS on wall in both top and bottom compartments.

To provide and fix in each window at top and bottom, Bronzed Standard Nars, tapped every inch, Malleable Iron Brackets and three rows of Serpentine-shaped Shelves at bottom, 5/16ths" thick, 18", 15" and 12" wide, and two rows at top 11" wide.

To fix the fore-going complete, the price would be

The Ground Plan shows DOUBLE BENT END WALL CASES, eight of these to measure 9ft. long x 8ft.high; they would all be made from Mahogany, each with a 15" plinth at bottom and a bold worked cornice at top, and would be 15" deep. Each would have three opening, air-tight, plate glass sashes, plate glass bent ends, plate glass mirror back, and the inside of each fitted with Standard Bars, Brackets and three rows of Wood Shelves covered cloth.

The price of these Cases would be Fifty-eight Pounds (£58-0-0) each net.

Also to supply two WALL CASES for the bottom of Shop; these would be made to fit the angles of wall, measuring about 9ft. each way: the other particulars as other Cases.

These two Show Cases complete would cost you One Hundred and Eight Pounds (£108-0-0) net.

BLOCK CASES. Also to supply four DOUBLE BENT END BLOCK CASES, each 8ft.long x 3ft.3" high x 2ft.back to front, having plate glass bent ends, plate glass fronts and tops, mirror-lined, air-tight opening doors at back, and the inside of each fitted with Standard Bars, Brackets and two rows of Plate Glass Shelves, the price would be Forty-two Pounds (£42-0-0) each net.

MIRRORS.

To supply eight Plate Glass MIRRORS in Mahogany frames, each 2ft. wide, to go between Wall Cases, plinths and cornices to match Show Cases, these would be Four Pounds (£4-0-0) each net: £32-0-0 in all.

We should roughly estimate that sending men over to fix the Show Cases in position, including fares, same would cost about Eighteen Pounds (£18-0-0)

As you will note, these prices are net, and include packing, but not carriage.

If ordinary opal shades were supplied in place of the Holophane shades in the above estimate the price would be reduced by about £2. but the above shades will give an increase of about 40% of light in a downward direction where it is most required.
