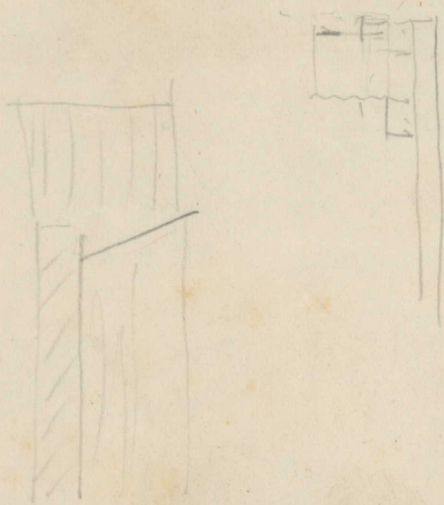

Dear Sir,

Referring to interview this morning.

As we stated to you, we received instructions to lodge claims on behalf of the Irish Church Mission Society in respect of (1) damage done to the premises known as the Lurgan Street Ragged school, estimated loss £ 86, and (2) damage to the premises known as the boys Home, Grand Canal Street, estimated loss about £70.

Informations as to both were sworn on the 14th June last. We can produce the originals for your inspection if you desire to see them.

We were also instructed to lodge claims by a Mr Thomas Smith in respect of damage done to the premises No 12, Poolbeg Street and 14½ Cole's Lane, estimated damage about £500, and the informations were sworn on the 23rd and 30th May; and they too are at your disposal.

By some mischance none of the claims were lodged.

We shall be much obliged if you will kindly let us have the forms necessary to make the claims now through your Committee. We have everything ready for your assessor to make the necessary inspection.
