With further reference to our recent correspondence Mr MacGarvey called here to-day and handed ~~me~~ the enclosed Statutory Declaration duly completed. The delay in sending same in was due to MacGarvey's being moving about the country in connexion with his professional work as an Entertainer.

Mr MacGarvey has filled up this Claim for £13:13:0 but he is of opinion that this amount is considerably under the true value of the original manuscript materials contained in the Book. He informs me that amongst other items were four original unpublished Monologues which would be worth at least £2:2:0 each and Nineteen Folk Poems which were also unpublished and which unfortunately, as is also the case with the Monologues, Mr MacGarvey cannot ~~cannot~~ reproduce from memory and of which he has no other record and he values these at 10/6 each at the very lowest, as he has been in the habit of obtaining as much as £1:1:0 each for short Poems of this
