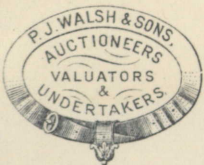



Main Roof.

To take out the slates that have been temporarily fixed in cement mortar, and reset same, supply any slates where missing, raking out and pointing portion of the ridge tiles, rerunning the fillets, cleaning out the gutters.

for the sum of ..... £4. 10. 0.

2 Pair back room.

2 squares of glass as broken by bullets to be supplied and glazed, repair sash bar, repair the walls, neatly fill in the bullet holes, paint and paper the room where damaged.

Photographic laboratory, room at back.

Outside pair of casement windows shattered to be repaired.

~~The~~ large square of glass 3'7" X 1'7" to be supplied and glazed, Walls pierced by bullets to be made good and surface re-plastered.

2nd back room.

The sash bar to be neatly repaired, press doors to have bullet holes stopped in, ceilings and walls repaired, entire ceiling prepared and statuary whitened, the walls rubbed down and colored, the woodwork painted two coats. 2 panes picture glass broken to be supplied and glazed and moulding repaired. Book shelves to be repaired.
