

Your letter intimates that no claim was received by the Committee in this case. Our instructions from Mr Carey are that a claim was despatched and posted to your Committee by Mrs Carey, and in response to some inquiry she understood that the matter would be dealt with in course by your Committee.

We shall be glad if you will kindly look further into matter and have same disposed of. The facts referred to can be verified by Declaration which ought to suffice, but perhaps with a gentleman in Mr Carey's position this will not be required. The matter is a comparatively small one
