Dear Sir,

It has only just come to our notice that Kil cask No 435436 delivered with Ale to Mr J. J. Farrell, Marlboro' Street, 21st February 1916, has not yet been returned and was evidently destroyed during the Rebellion. On making application to Mr Farrell, he tells us that his claim has been settled some months ago, and consequently it is too late to include in his statement.

The value of the cask is 33/- , and we should be much obliged if you would send us the necessary form to fill up.

A considerable number of our empties which were on Licensed premises at the time of the Rebellion were lost, but in all cases, with this exception, they were charged to the Customer, who in turn included them in his claim.
