I propose to hack out and glaze all windows on front of the above mentioned numbers in 21 ounce glass to the number of 13 pages of glass, Size from three foot by 21 inches down to 14 by 10 that has been damaged by the recent Rebellion.

Roofs of the above mentioned numbers to be repaired including Chimneys and Chimney pots that has been badly damaged by the recent R Rebellion.

Roofs of return buildings and out houses to be repaired that is at present badly damaged. Yard wall dividing 16 & 17 and to clean away rubbish from yard caused by falling down wall to be replaced in concrete to the distance of 20 feet by five feet high that has been damaged by recent Rebellion. 1 & 2 Davitt Parade to hack out and glaze windows to the number of 12 panes Size 2 foot five by 16 inches, and to repair roofs and chimneys and roofs where damaged by recent Rebellion, including wall over back door entrance.
