I desire to bring under the notice of your Association that I lost a waterproof coat which I left at Mr. Elvery's Sackville St. for repairs. I left the coat at Mr. Elvery's about a fortnight prior to the rebellion and when I called for it later, Mr. Elvery informed me that it was either looted or

destroyed by fire. A note which he gave to this effect, I now enclose. The coat was a "Service" one and, as I was having the repairs executed at my own expense, I did not then apply to my authorities for the necessary permission to have the repairs carried out. Consequently, I could not apply to them for the issue of a coat in lieu of the lost one. The only way out of the difficulty was to purchase

another coat, which I did hope that it will
at a cost of 15/-. I made receive your earnest
a claim recently to Mr. and favourable consideration.

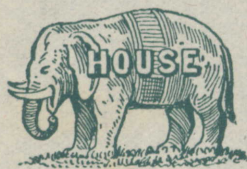
