Dear Sir,

We are acting for Mrs Kathleen McKenna of 63 Trinity Street, Drogheda, and we enclose a Claim and Declaration duly made by her claiming the sum of £4.4.0. in connection with the loss during the Rebellion of an overcoat, her property, which was left with Mr G.R. Mesias of 5 Eden Quay, Dublin.

Mrs McKenna was under the impression that Mr Mesias had sent in a claim with regard to his own property which was lost during the Rebellion, and also putting in a claim on behalf of his customers, including the claim for our client, but it appears that Mr Mesias wrote to our client informing her that he was only claiming on his own behalf, but owing to Mrs McKenna being away from home at the time, she did not receive this communication and it was only within the last couple of weeks that she was aware that no claim was put in on her behalf, and we respectfully ask, ~~xxx~~ notwithstanding the lapse of time since the Rebellion, and owing to the fact that the delay not being caused through any fault of our client, your committee to consider her application.
