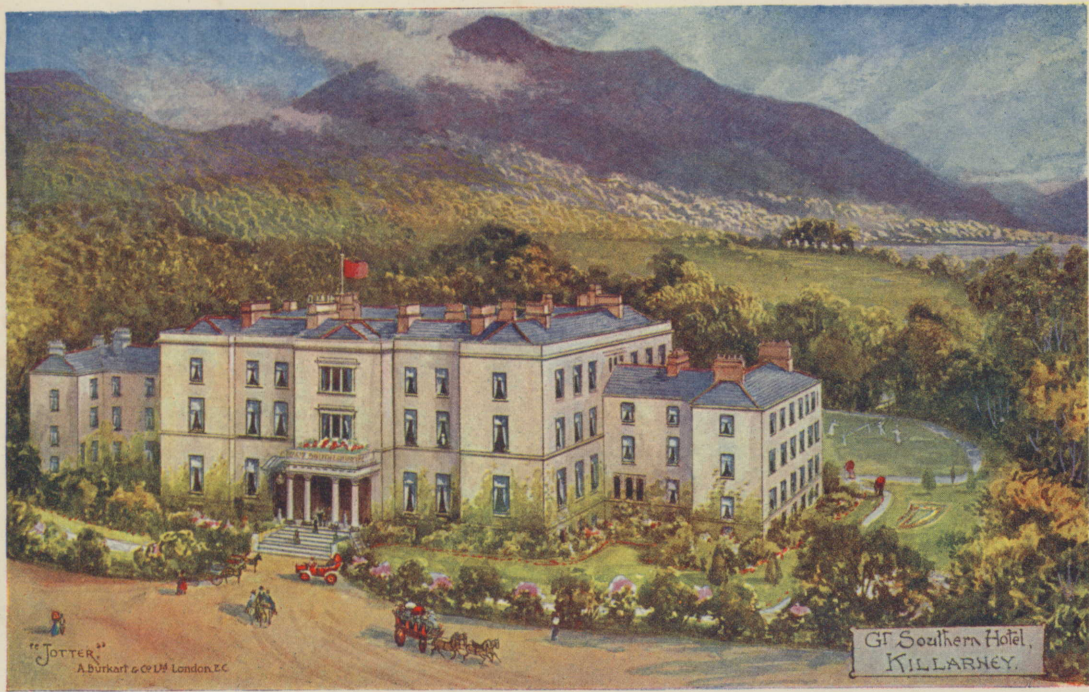

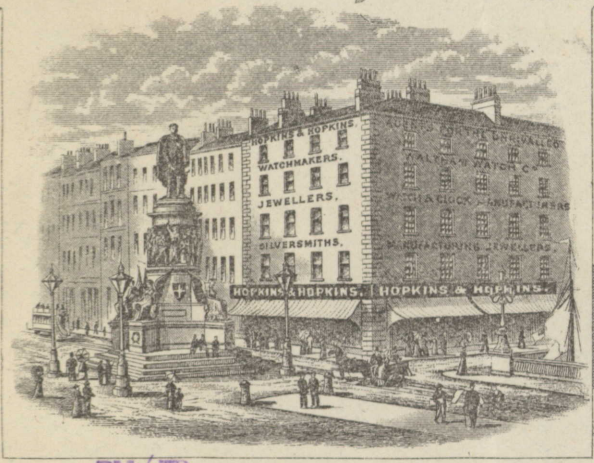
just before the Rebellion last
