

TELEGRAMS: "MEYTHER, DUBLIN".

Dear Madam,

We are in receipt of your letter and in reply beg to inform you that responsibility the Government accepted full, for all property destroyed in our premises during the Rebellion. As notified in the public press all claims should be in before the I2th., August1916 but if you will write to J. J. Healy Esc Secretary, Property Losses Committee, 5I Stephens Green, Dublin he may send you on the forms to fill up but we were in no way responsible for damage done to our premises.
