In reply to your letter of the 4th instant in above, I beg to say that the first intimation of this claim received by the Committee was on the 26th ultimo. On the 30th June, 1916, a notice appeared in the Dublin newspapers that owners of property lost in connection with the disturbances of April-May 1916, should apply to the Committee, and subsequently an announcement appeared that the 16th August, 1916, was the latest date for notifying claims.

As the Committee's investigation is completed and their final report signed they regret that they are unable now to deal with this claim.
