Claim of Michael Jones.

Mr Taylor.

In reply to your Minute of 4th instant, the claim in this case was only received here on the 30th ultimo, - Messrs. Hopkins & Hopkins having for the first time written regarding it on the previous day - but the Committee's investigation was then completed and their final report prepared and they were unable to deal with it.

The explanation furnished by Mr Jones as to the delay in lodging his claim with the Committee is not quite satisfactory. Notices appeared more than once in all the Dublin daily papers calling on persons who had lost property to lodge their claims here. It was well known in the city for many months past that claimants, including some hundreds of Messrs. Hopkins and Hopkins customers, were being paid compensation. Messrs. Hopkins had re-started business on the old site at a very early date, and had Mr Jones made inquiry before a period of nearly 11 months had elapsed he would have been advised of the necessity for lodging a claim direct with the Committee.
