Dear Sir,

I am directed by the Board of Guardians to inform you, that a very short time previous to the Rebellion in Dublin, a clock value £1.8.5., paid at the Finance of the Guardians on the 8th March, 1916, which had been just supplied to the Dispensary at North Clarence St., from Messrs. Hopkins & Hopkins, was taken back by them for adjustment, and was of course destroyed the time Messrs. Hopkin's premises were burnt. I was quite unaware that any clock the property of the Board of Guardians had been on these premises, or I would have sent you a claim in due course, and it was only last week I learned of the matter.

If your Fund has not been closed, the Guardians will thank you to include their small loss among your grants.
