Dear Sir, re Claim Globe Parcel Express : 5384.

The following extra claims have been received by the Globe Parcel Express which at the time of the settlement of their claim the "Globe" were not aware of. They are as follows:-

Goods in transit from J.B. Lewis & Son Ltd,

Haydn Road, Nottingham, £54.18. 0  
to Messrs Robertson Ledlie & Ferguson,  
Belfast.

The "Globe" have received notice that these goods were delivered to them on Easter Saturday and as their books were all destroyed, they had to rely upon their clients sending forward claims together with the Shipping Company's receipts of delivery to the "Globe". They had no information about this item the loss of which has been proved.

The other item is from Messrs Baker & Coy, Wholesale Manufacturing Confectioners Cork. These two items were destroyed and the amount of the invoice is £12. 1. 0. There has been some misunderstanding between the Globe Parcel Express and Messrs Baker with regard to this claim. The "Globe"



were under the impression that Messrs Newsom had included these items in the claim which the Globe Express had received from them; as Bakers, and Newsoms, are two departments of one concern. This was incorrect. The "Globe" have now to pay £12. 1. 0 to Baker & Coy, being responsible for the goods in transit.

The Globe Express are therefore liable for the following amounts :-

Re Claim 5764.

Our clients the Globe Express Ltd., lodged a claim with the Committee in respect of damaged caused to their premises etc., at 7 and 8 Eden Quay during the rebellion.

An item in the claim was in respect of goods which were in their stores at Easter week and which were received in the ordinary course of their business for conveyance. At the time formal notice of the claim was lodged it was not possible to state the exact amount our clients would have to claim in respect of this item because they could not state what goods were on their premises when the fire took place and it was only as each claim came in separately from consignees and consignors that particulars could be given to the Government assessors.

From time to time these claims as they came in were referred to Messrs Montgomery & Co., the Government Assessors and our clients thought they had ascertained their full liability for goods destroyed on the premises. A few days ago however they received a claim from Messrs J. B. Lewis & Sons Ltd.

of Nottingham for £54:18:0 in respect of goods which were sent by them on April 11th 1916 for conveyance to Messrs Robertson Lealie & Ferguson Belfast and which were not delivered to the Consignors.

Our clients inform us that this consignment was proved to have been delivered to them on the 22nd April 1916 and was therefore in their store during Easter week and was destroyed.

They have also received a claim by Messrs Baker & Co., of Cork a wholesale manufacturing confectioners amounting to £12:1:0. Portion of this consignment was despatched from Cork on the 20th of April 1916 and the remaining portion consisted of goods removed from Mr. Finnigan of Georges Quay and held by the Globe Express for Messrs Baker & Co's disposal.

Having regard to the special circumstances of these claimers our clients would be glad if you would obtain the consent of the Committee to lodge a supplementary claim to cover these two items.
