Dear Sir /

I am instructed by Mr. Lawrence Byrne of Lr. Camden St. Dublin, Butcher, for leave to lodge a claim with your Committee with reference to meat stolen from him during the recent disturbances in Dublin.

The reasons that he did not send in his claim sooner are that he was erroneously under the impression that unless he had filed an information for malicious injuries within the time limited for same 4 days, that he could not have his claim investigated by your Committee. The circumstances of his claim are, that he was conveying meat in a cart for the purpose of feeding some of the people living in the outline districts of Rathfarnham when the cart was set upon and attacked by the Rebels, and only for the interference of a Catholic Priest there, the whole cart load would have been looted and destroyed, as it was a considerable quantity was taken.
