
Dear Sir,

Revd. A. W. Barton.

We wish to formally notify you on behalf of the
Revd. A.W. Barton that we intend to lodge a claim for com-
pensation in respect of the premises Nos. 6 and 7, Lower
Sackville Street, Dublin, which were totally destroyed by
fire during the Rebellion, and out of which he received as
regards No. 6 Lr. Sackville Street a yearly adjusted rent of
£122 : 5 : 2, and as regards No. 7 Lr. Sackville St. a yearly
adjusted rent of £100 : 7 : 0.
