Dear Mr Healy,

I return herewith the correspondence you have had with Mr Triston regarding Miss Evans' Claim.

On enquiry I find that the Miss Evans referred to, before going abroad, left some Linen goods to the value of £40. in Messrs Clery's keeping. Owing to her residence in Portugal it was impossible to get Miss Evans' signature to a Claim in the ordinary way and therefore Messrs Clery & Company included the amount of £40. in their Claim under the head of Customers' Goods for which they were responsible.

I have instructed the Secretary of Clery & Company to inform Mr Triston of these facts and to say that as soon as our Claim for Stock has been settled Messrs Clery & Company will pay over to Mr Triston the amount of Miss Evans' Claim.
