Dear Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 29th instant, I beg to state that Mr Lea's claim in respect of customers' goods lost in his premises and for which he was not liable, was disallowed by the Property Losses Committee, and he was so advised at the time. The owners of all property lost during the disturbances were informed through notices in the newspapers that they should send their claims to the Committee. As the Committee has sent its final report to the Government and has ceased to exist, it is much regretted that nothing can now be done in this matter.

Dear Sir,

At the time of the Rebellion I had a ship's clock worth £15 left with Mr Bernard Lee, at 24 Eden Quay for repairs.

The clock has been lost in the ruins and I wish to know what can be done to recoup me for my loss.

Mr Bernard Lee tells me that he is not responsible for goods left in his custody in the circumstances, but I understand compensation has been paid for losses similar to mine, and I will be much obliged if you will let me hear from you on the matter.
