In reply to your letter of the 2nd instant with enclosures, I beg to state that Mr Lea's claim in respect of customers' goods lost in his premises and for which he was not liable, was disallowed by the Property Losses Committee, and he was so advised at the time. The owner of all property lost during the disturbances were informed through notices in the newspapers that they should send their claims to the Committee. As the Committee has send its final report to the Government and has ceased to exist, it is much regretted that nothing can now be done in this matter.

Shave the honour to forward two notes received from Dublin in reference to two Compresses destroyed in the fire: - contents of these notes explain the position. - one compass a girl spirit Compass I had

placed in the hands of M. Bernard Lee for attention and was rathed at £ 4. N Nequest compensation.

The Second compan I had arranged to purchase from Mr. Burned Lea (an ordinary ships compan) for 30/0 after certain repairs of he magnetic attention: - I am in doubt but I am of opinion Mr. Burned Lea should claim for the loss of this as a question arises as to whether sale was completed. If he has been reposed compensation in the plea that this compans was my property, I then be to claim

Compensation at 30%, and should hand over the amount recovered to M. Bernerd Lea. - I I am Lir Spour obedient servant William Pellar
