Dear Sir,

In October 1915, we supplied Printing Ink to The Freeman's Journal, Ltd., Dublin, in 12 (twelve-dozen pound) drums, which drums are our property.

On our applying recently for the return of these drums, The Freeman's Journal, Ltd., inform us that they were destroyed in the fire resulting from the disturbances of the 24th April 1916, and referring us to you as the authority with whom we should lodge our claim. The value of these drums is 10/- each, i.e. the total value 26, and we shall be glad if you will lay this claim before your Committee, and advise us in the course of post when you think this matter will receive their consideration.
