On the 27th. ulto, we wrote to Messra- Tames neitly & Co. Ltd.,

"We handed to you on April 10th, ten bass of Steel Wool consigned to Messrs. F. W. Woolworth & Co. Ltd. of 66/67 Grafton Street, Dublin. They advise us this morning that only 8 bass have been received. Please have the two remaining bass delivered and advise us that this has been done."
