I was speaking to Mr Moore who before the Rebellion rented a Jewellers Shop in St. Sackville Street and whom I had not seen from just before he lost his business until the other day. Now I had left in his house for cleaning a heavy gold curb bangle which was destroyed with all his other goods and believing he had claimed compensation for same I spoke to him. Now he refers me to you the price of bangle being £3.17-6 bought from Hopkins Sackville Street in or about ten years ago being a present from my brother-in-law at the time of his marriage with my sister. I would be grateful if you will settle this for me as I would wish to receive compensation for same. The man who sold me the bangle was Mr Stokes of Westmoreland Street who was at that time in Hopkins. Hoping to hear from you.
