Dear Sir,

My Client Mr. Michael Tierney of Princes Street, Dublin, has received a cheque on account for the sum of £350. He attended at the Chief Secretary's Office for information as to the balance of his claim and was there referred to you. The payment is stated in the order to be made on account of the goods etc., on the premises. We understand therefore, that it is not in any way on account of ~~the~~ the claim for building. As Mr. Tierney's claim on account of his Stock was for a much larger amount than the amount now paid, we will be glad if you can inform us what was the recommendation of your Commissioners in Mr. Tierney's case. You will readily understand that the sum received is, if anything, a disadvantage to Mr. Tierney in as much as he is unable with it to pay the numerous Creditors who have been deferring their demands for payment in contemplation of his receipt of compensation. Of course a man in his position is always in debt for a considerable amount of the Stock in hands, which he obtained on the terms of credit usual in his trade. As we have already pointed out in a former letter, his case is one of peculiar hardship. We can ourselves see no reason why there should be any delay in paying him the amount of the

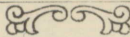

I am writing you in connection with the Claim of my Client Mr. Michael Tierney, who is tenant of the Premises known as The Princes Stores, Princes Street. I venture to ask for the special consideration of the Commissioners with a view of having an immediate payment made to the Claimant. His case is one of peculiar hardship. Mr. Tierney was for many years the Manager of these premises. He purchased them some years ago, for a very heavy price. Since then he has continued to develop the business with success. He devoted particular attention to the provision of luncheons, as distinguished from the ordinary part of the trade of a Licensed house. He took particular pride in the character of his house, and in the way it was appointed and served. Reference to his claim will show that he kept a large staff; this was because of the large luncheon trade he carried on. Some time ago, before the outbreak, when I had occasion to visit the "Freeman's Journal" Office, I called in to see Mr. Tierney, and could not help expressing my admiration of the way his house was fitted. Everything he had in the world was blotted out in the course of the Insurrection. I do not wish to trouble the Commissioners with details ~~of reference~~, as

of course they are familiar with all the aspects of these cases. In Mr. Tierney's case his loss is clearly defined. He was entirely dependent on what he could earn out of these Premises. I trust the Commissioners could see their way to help him by an immediate payment.
