

Claim for Compensation.

Sir,

We are acting for Messrs John Smalley, Ralph Smalley, Thos Smalley, and Thomas J. Smalley, carrying on business as James Winstanley at 5 North Earl Street Dublin, and write to inform you that the Warehouse, Shop and building known as No 5 Nth Earl St and the furniture goods chattels and property therein were destroyed between the 29th April and the 2nd May last, while some persons were unlawfully riotously and tumultuously assembled together. The value of the damage done amounts to £6,300 for which sum our clients seek compensation.
