Interests in the buildings

The Claimant at the time of the destruction of the premises was a traveller for Messrs. Young, Ironmongers. The Engine claimed for was put into the premises for purpose of sale. He procured it some years ago from his father and I was unable to obtain exact details as to its cost. I inspected the damaged engine in the yard of Messrs. Woodham & Ethridge at 57a, Townshend Street, who gave 30/- for the salvage. There are some small details of the Engine lying in 59 Middle Abbey Street which I also inspected. These are quite useless. I subsequently called on Messrs. Young and elicited information as to what Claimant would have expected for the article, and I found that, if pressed, he would have taken £15. for same. Allowing, therefore, £12. 10. 0., and £1. 10. 0. salvage, the total £14. would about recompense him for his loss.
