Dear Sir,

I beg to forward herewith, in duplicate, form of claim in connection with the above, duly filled in: also Messrs. James Adam & Sons' Valuation of 8th May last, together with copy of same, and the Liverpool & London & Globe Insurance Company's Policies, numbered 11691311, for £2840:18:0., and 11690530, for £2333:16:0. You will notice that the latter Policy was taken out by me to cover my furniture etc. against loss or damage (including that caused by Fire) directly occasioned by or happening through Riot, Civil Commotion, Civil War, Revolution, Rebellion or Military or Usurped Power, but excluding loss or damage directly or indirectly occasioned by or happening through Invasion or Foreign Enemy. The difference between the two above-mentioned figures, viz. £507. odd, represents the value of my silver and plated goods, which, when not in use, are stored in a strong room.

If there is any further information which you require, I shall, on hearing from you, be happy to furnish it.
