do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 24th day of April 1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely:—

Goods arrived from England lying at Shipping Co's Stores and such damage was occasioned to the best of my belief by the Shipping Co's Stores being broken into, and the Goods looted

And I We further declare that the Property and Articles specified on the other side were so destroyed or damaged; that the Cost Price of same was as shown in each case; that at the time of the destruction or damage they were respectively of the Values specified under the head "Value of Property at time of Destruction or Damage"; and that, in consequence of such destruction or damage, claim is hereby made for the sums specified under the head "Amount Claimed"; that the Claim is made by me as such secretary for the said Owners; and that no person is interested in the said property except Beilaw & Boyd Ltd
