Having examined the damage done to above on Messrs Allen's side during the recent disturbance. per Corporation Notice I find that to shore up the beams and brickwork and build new pier in cement grouted mortar under end of beam and build up brickwork of chimney breast where destroyed. including all labour & materials under cost £8.10.0

This work should be attended to immediately as this is a most dangerous condition & may collapse any moment.
