Numbers of the articles have been repaired, and others have been sold, but in some of the items I find that the amount claimed is excessive. For instance, the 7th item - £5 - is not an ebony cabinet but an oak one, its cost not being more than, I should say, £4. Repairs up to 20/- have been carried out to it, which does not depreciate its value very much. It is difficult to obtain full details in regard to the jewellery items. Claimant cannot supply invoices. I believe £40. would be a fair estimate of her actual loss on furniture.
