Mr Dale formerly connected with the Estate Duty Office in Dublin

retired to Devonshire on pension & was returning to take up residence in Ireland. His entire household effects were removed by Pickfords to Dublin & were looted from the Stores of the B & I, Steam P. Company. There was an effort made to insure but Pickfords stated they could not place the Insurance owing to submarines. £23 for freight was paid to Pickford. We have reason to believe that the values are not overstated details of linen for over £100 having been furnished against a claim of £50 thereon.
