On Merchandise (excluding Cottons and all other Vegetable Fibres and Grasses and Petroleum and all Mineral and Rock Oil and Lubricating Oil containing Mineral Oil, Naphtha, Turpentine, and the liquid products of any of them) the property of the Insured or held by him in trust or on commission for which he is responsible in no case exceeding the market value of the same immediately before the fire in all or any of the Warehouses, Sheds, Vaults and Cellars registered "R" by the Fire Salvage Association of Liverpool Limited for the storage of Grain/ Seeds (other than Oil Seeds) and Bread stuffs and/or Provisions and/or Fruit and/or Leather (but excluding Warehouses registered "R" for Wool, Sugar, and Rubber and the Liverpool Grain Storage and Transit Company's Alexandra Warehouses, Regent Road, Bootle and Granary No.3 Coburg Dock), and in all or any of the Ground Floor and Basement Stores used for Provision Storage only and forming part of Building not otherwise used as Warehouses and in which no process of manufacture is carried on and also on any such Merchandise (i.e. that is Merchandise allowed to be stored in the "R" Warehouses to which this Insurance applies), in all or any of the Dock Transit Sheds, Quays, Wharves and whilst in transit between any of the Dock said places and on board any Ship or Vessel - all situate within six miles of the Liverpool Town Hall, and whilst contained in all or any of the Brick and Stone built and Slated or Tiled Granaries and Sheds including Carriers and Railway and Steam Packet Stores and Sheds in the City of Dublin.
