Interests in the buildings

Award of Committee:

The building is used as two Hucksters' Shops and as tenements above. I find that a good deal ofglass was broken, but it must be taken into account that some of this glass was only patched prior to the Rebellion. For instance the front windows of the shop do not appear for some time to have been one continuous pane. It was one piece added to another. In the top front room there are five panes of glass 1' x 1' to be renewed, and 7 panes in the top back toom 1' 6" x 1'. The timber partition was badly riddled by bullets which passed through the door and damaged the stairs. £6. 10. 0. cught to make good the glass and the damage to timber.

The external repairs comprised 1 foot of chimney stack built and five new chimney pots. The remainder of the stack shows that it was defective prior to the

Contentsebellion. The back chimney stack has been cemented with two new chimney pots. Allowing for slight damage to the roof I consider £6 would cover these items.

Dear Sir.

I examined the house 95, Capel St. I find the chimney stack is in a dangerous state, portion of same will require to be taken down and rebuilt; supplying new chimney pots. There is also damage done to roof and gutters which will require to be made good. The front and back top rooms will be required to be repaired and glazed. The walls throughout are in a bad state and require plastering and papering, also landing window glass renewed.

The present condition of the above premises is the result of the recent destruction in the city, as you know the above quarter was the scene of great devastation and havoc.

It will cost in all to cover the outlay etc. for above work the sum of £17. 10. 0.
