I was somewhat surprised to learn from the Claimants that no estimate was obtained for repairing the damage, but I have inspected the Contractors' receipt for the payment. On making inquiries, however, I find the amount reasonable and beg to recommend payment. The Firm have a Plate Glass Policy with the Royal Insurance Co. but there is a clause exempting the Company from liability in the circumstances.
