MEMORANDUM.

Patrick Conway.


The Plate Glass in regard to which a sum of £ 63 - 13 - 11 is claimed, was insured by the Celtic Insurance Company, which Company's Policy covers breakage, except that resulting from explosion or fire. The Glass was shattered by the concussion of a Naval Gun which was fired by the Military outside Claimant's premises.

We understand that a claim was made upon the Insurance Company for the Plate Glass, and that the Company repudiated liability. Claimant's Solicitor had a Writ settled by Counsel to serve upon the Insurance Company, but that Writ was never issued, as the Celtic Insurance Company requested that proceedings might be deferred pending the result of the claim upon the Property Losses (Ireland) Committee. Meantime we have set out on our Report our estimate of the loss on Plate Glass.

As requested I carefully examined your premises, 70 Parnell St., on the 3rd inst., and again visited it this morning with a view to reporting on its stability, about which you were uneasy, on account of the recent gun firing which took place alongside you.

I understand, and in fact saw for myself, that all the plate glass of the shop windows was broken, evidently by the reverberation of the explosions, and some damage was done to the woodwork of the shop fronts.

Most of the glass in the windows of the upper stories was destroyed.

I can find no trace of damage to the

main fabric, and no evidence that the explosions have injured the brickwork or caused any fractures in either front.

The fanlight in the private W.C. on the first floor, at the head of the stairs, was shattered, and the ceiling of the corridor on the first floor running at right angles with the first flight of stairs, during the time of the gun firing, collapsed. It has now been reinstated and papered. You have an estimate and account for the re-plastering of this ceiling.
